POSTER SESSION SPECIFICATION INFORMATION

With the start of the 91st NARST Annual International Conference approaching soon, here are some specifications you may need for your poster presentation:

Date: Sunday, March 11th

Time: All poster sessions will occur in Concurrent Session #6 A 3:15 – 4:15 pm and Session #6B 4:15 – 5:15 pm. You are scheduled either for the first hour (Session A) or the second hour (Session B). Please refer to the program for your assigned time.

Location: Poster presentations will be held in Augusta Conference Center. Posters will be displayed / mounted on a poster display board (4' high x 8' long).

Logistics: Please note the Poster Session time on Sunday afternoon is immediately after the afternoon break (2:45 – 3:15 pm). Regardless of which session for which you are scheduled, you need to ensure your poster is set up prior to 3:15 pm. You may set your poster up beginning at 10:00 am. All posters must be taken down immediately following the conclusion of the session (and prior to 6:00 pm).

Poster Display: The poster display board is 4' high by 8' long (horizontal orientation). The poster surface is made of fabric-covered cork. ***Each presenter should make sure to bring any necessary supplies to affix your poster to the poster display board.*** NARST will have a limited supply of push pins available.



General Information:

The Annual Meeting Conference Program indicates the poster board number to which you have been assigned. The presenting author should be available throughout the session (Session #6A or #6B). The poster should be as self-explanatory as possible, thereby enabling you to supplement the information presented. The poster session format affords you the opportunity to engage in a discussion of your research. Each presenter is expected to have a manuscript for distribution to attendees. The manuscript may be available either via hard copy distribution at the session or via electronic access provided by the author.
